Prayer awareness : Romans 1:11 Trust

From the latest Prayer Update from Jackie Woodley: Please pray for those we support in Uganda; they hear about the rapidly rising case numbers in England and worry for our health. In their eyes we are a rich developed country that is suffering majorly. It makes them worried what may happen in their more underdeveloped country with limited resources and the need to pay for medical bills and hospital visits. Their country is still struggling with simpler things like maintaining hygiene to stop the spread and preventing those that get ill from spreading the virus in such close quarters. Many houses have only a couple of rooms so isolating when there is a family of 5 or 6 is very impractical.

Pray for the children in Uganda that are no longer allowed to go to schools. They may not be able to study at home and we know parents are struggling to feed children who would normally be boarding at school. We have the resources in the UK to home-school our families; in Uganda many parents do not have the knowledge to do this. Many Ugandans do not own Bibles or cannot read sufficiently to use them and we know this will add to the pressures they are feeling, especially where they (like ourselves), are without Sunday services and other weekly meetings. Please pray that they remain steadfast in their faith and their love for Him. Pray also that those struggling will be led to Jesus; times like this allow us the time to wonder about the bigger questions in life - let Jesus be the One to answer. Also, I am no longer able to continue as administrator for the Romans 1:11 Trust. Rachel Bailey (daughter of Chris Copley) will take over from me and, as friends of over 10 years, I know she will do an amazing job. Blessings, Jackie.
