SCRIPTURE - Luke 16 : 1 - 16
THEME - Capitalist or Christian?

Christianity isn't Communism, but it's also not Capitalism. We look today at some of the ways we might get brainwashed by the worst parts of our money-based culture, and forget our Christian life. What does Scripture say?

This month we bring you happier news. Despite the continuing growth of Covid-19 in our own country, and the ever-changing local lockdowns, for our brothers and sisters in Uganda lockdown is starting to ease. We have heard from many of our Ugandan friends that, after 6 months of closure, the churches have been allowed to open. However, like us, they must still follow strict social distancing and cleanliness procedures such as hand washing, maximum numbers of people and the use of temperature guns. Unfortunately, the cost of such measures is out of reach of most of the rural churches which we support and therefore they have not been able to open. Please pray that the costs of such items will reduce and allow the churches to open. As well as the churches, the candidate classes (those who will sit exams this year) are now able to return to school. Please pray that this change goes well and does not result in new cases.

Martin Sendagi has also been in contact and we thank God that there has been great growth in the church in his area during lockdown. He has been able to open 15 more churches in the deep rural areas around his home, and the building of these churches, in addition to his current ones has allowed over 400 children to attend Secondary school in his area. Please pray for Martin, that this growth continues and that God blesses those in the new churches.

Monthly Charities Update

In September our additional charity was One25, a Bristol women's charity which reaches out to some of the city's most marginalised women. Their vision is a world where women are safe, feel loved and thrive. This month we are supporting Care for the Family, a national charity who aim to promote strong family life and to help those who face family difficulties.

Paul Ssemwanga also shared with us that the Luwafu community clinic has been able to open and run during lockdown. We pray that God will allow the clinic to feed children from the age of two to the age of six which is their aim; this will go a great way to ensuring good health. However, he has also told us the stigmatism that those who get ill are facing at this time. Please join us in praying for those who have been stigmatised, that God will lift this label and bless them.
